

Run-throughs will be in the Club Ring on the first Monday of the Month. Numbers for July 1 have been reached but there will be further opportunities each month.

Trick Dog Lists and Judges Mark Sheets will be provided, but bring your own props and treats. Your runthroughs will be recorded and checked, and feedback will be provided.



May Obedience and Rally Trial report Contributor: Judy McCartney, HDC Trial Secretary

I have never seen such a large drop-out rate of competitors. Of the 91 entered into Obedience, 32 turned up, and in Rally, instead of 120, we had 60. That said, the weather was really kind to us. It misted gently for the entire Obedience trial, then came down steadily until 1.00 pm when the Rally commenced, and then stayed dry for the rest of the afternoon. Of the entrants we did have, we got more qualifications than a lot of other, better-attended trials, and the people who had made the effort to come were all happy and smiling. It was a really nice trial.

Bob's heroic efforts to find stewards was rewarded by a quality bunch who were there toiling steadily all day. All the Judges had plenty of help, and the competitors were channelled smoothly through the rings. I finally had a grip on the titles for presentations – so that went well.

Anne and Janet were meticulous at the check-in. We handle the Obedience check-in but normally ask the Rally stewards to do their check-in at the ring. This trial, because of the damp conditions, we had to also handle the Rally check-in and that was a lot of extra pressure and potential chaos. They were great. And, of course, Anne printed all the qually cards and even dealt with the old printer finally running out of ink and having to get the other printer to cooperate. Many, many thanks. Others were quietly everywhere ensuring the stewards had what they needed and then tirelessly helping with the clean-up at the end.

Ground Rules

- 1. **Vaccinations**: As a condition of membership, all dogs are required to be properly vaccinated according to current veterinary guidelines.
- 2. **Dog Behaviour:** Members are responsible at all times for the behaviour of their dog/s whilst present on the training grounds or representing the club.
- 3. **Appropriate Equipment:** All dogs must have properly fitted equipment and remain on lead at all times (unless instructed otherwise by a club instructor). No check/choker chains are to be used on any dogs in Puppy, Beginners or Graduate classes.
- 4. **No Ill-treatment:** A member shall not ill-treat a dog at any time. Any such action may give rise to suspension or expulsion from the Club by resolution of the Committee.
- 5. **Bitches in Season:** Bitches in season and/or dog/s which are unwell or have an infectious condition are not permitted on the obedience training grounds.
- 7. **Clean up after Dogs:** Members are to pick up after their dog/s and help keep the grounds clean and tidy.
- 7. **Sensible Footwear/Clothing:** Adequate sensible dress with appropriate footwear (no thongs, scuffs on bare feet) is required to be worn by handlers during training.
- 8. **Supervision Required:** Dogs are not to be left unattended whilst on the training grounds unless crated or tethered in a safe area. Members are reminded not to approach dogs that are confined. All dogs are to be kept under control and supervised while at the counter or in the clubhouse.
- 9. **Muzzles**: The Club reserves the right to ask any member to muzzle or in extreme cases, remove their dog/s from the training grounds. If a muzzle is required, this must remain in place whilst on the club grounds. This will be at the discretion of the Committee.

- 10. **Club Equipment Use**: Members who use Club equipment must ensure it is returned to the storeroom and stored correctly after classes are conducted.
- 11. **Child/Junior Handlers:** Children are welcome to attend classes provided they are supervised by an adult/parent/ guardian at all times.
- 12. **Child Members:** Child members (aged 7 to 11 are to be accompanied by an adult/parent/guardian in classes). Junior members (aged 12 to 15 under adult/parent/guardian supervision on grounds) are welcome to train provided they have sufficient control of their dog during classes. This will be at the discretion of the class/chief instructor.
