(12 YEARS TO UNDER 16 YEARS)

Did you know you receive the Robert
Smiles Achievement Certificate if you
train a dog through to class 8 and then
achieve promotion to Graduate Class.
The certificate celebrates what you and
your dog have achieved as Junior
Handlers!

Robert was a much-loved member of the Hills community from 2006 – 2019 and the Junior Handler achievement certificate was created as a tribute to Robert.

At 15, he was our youngest ever instructor. We were all deeply saddened by his passing

in 2019 at the age of 24 and below is a little about Robert as previously recalled by Dianne Atkins our then Chief Instructor!

"Robert joined our Club (with his mum Robyn) when he was 10 years old and at this young age was always there to help out where needed. He made sure our senior members had a chair to sit on, and that our equipment was out for training sessions.

At 14 Robert completed our Instructors course and assisted in class till the age of 15 when he then started taking classes with great confidence.

In 2009 I nominated Robert on behalf of Hills Dog Club Inc. for a Hills Shire Council Young Citizen Youth Award. His work in the Community was recognised and he was presented with this well-deserved award.

In 2009 Robert took on the challenge of training one of my Border Collies - Maggie. He wanted to learn more advanced work. With his commitment to training he decided to enter trials and gained her Community Companion Dog Title (CCD). They made a great team and the understanding between them was something very special

Dear Robert! All of us at Hills are so glad to have met you and it was our pleasure to have been in your life and see you grow from a young boy to a gorgeous young man. Robert you will always be in our hearts."

Ground Rules

- 1. **Vaccinations**: As a condition of membership, all dogs are required to be properly vaccinated according to current veterinary guidelines.
- 2. **Dog Behaviour:** Members are responsible at all times for the behaviour of their dog/s whilst present on the training grounds or representing the club.
- 3. **Appropriate Equipment:** All dogs must have properly fitted equipment and remain on lead at all times (unless instructed otherwise by a club instructor). No check/choker chains are to be used on any dogs in Puppy, Beginners or Graduate classes.
- 4. **No III-treatment:** A member shall not ill-treat a dog at any time. Any such action may give rise to suspension or expulsion from the Club by resolution of the Committee.
- 5. **Bitches in Season:** Bitches in season and/or dog/s which are unwell or have an infectious condition are not permitted on the obedience training grounds.
- 7. **Clean up after Dogs:** Members are to pick up after their dog/s and help keep the grounds clean and tidy.
- 7. **Sensible Footwear/Clothing:** Adequate sensible dress with appropriate footwear (no thongs, scuffs on bare feet) is required to be worn by handlers during training.
- 8. **Supervision Required:** Dogs are not to be left unattended whilst on the training grounds unless crated or tethered in a safe area. Members are reminded not to approach dogs that are confined. All dogs are to be kept under control and supervised while at the counter or in the clubhouse.
- 9. **Muzzles**: The Club reserves the right to ask any member to muzzle or in extreme cases, remove their dog/s from the training grounds. If a muzzle is required, this must remain in place whilst on the club grounds. This will be at the discretion of the Committee.

- 10. **Club Equipment Use**: Members who use Club equipment must ensure it is returned to the storeroom and stored correctly after classes are conducted.
- 11. **Child/Junior Handlers:** Children are welcome to attend classes provided they are supervised by an adult/parent/ guardian at all times.
- 12. **Child Members:** Child members (aged 7 to 11 are to be accompanied by an adult/parent/guardian in classes). Junior members (aged 12 to 15 under adult/parent/guardian supervision on grounds) are welcome to train provided they have sufficient control of their dog during classes. This will be at the discretion of the class/chief instructor.

K9 Companion Award



K9 Companion Award

An Assessment for Hills Dog Club Members only

This Award is open to members with dogs in Class 8 or above

Assessments will be held: Monday 18th November 2024 starting from 7.15pm

Tuesday 19th November 2024 starting from 10.45am

The following elements are essential to undertake the test:

- For full details of the Award and information on exercises talk with your Class Instructor.
- Dogs must be at least 12 months of age. They must have completed our Beginners Course or be in Class 8 (or higher) of the Club's Course.
- · Proof of Council registration, microchipping and a current vaccination or equivalent certificate.
- · The dog should be presented in a clean and tidy manner.
- The dog should be fitted with an appropriate collar or restraint for that dog (i.e., collar, gentle collar, head collar and harness), and be on a leash. No check chains or slip leads permitted.
- . The Handler must carry a plastic bag at all times to clean up after his/her dog.
- Training treats are not to be given during exercises. Verbal praise is, however, permitted.
- The Handler may offer food rewards at the finish of each individual exercise.
- · A number of both verbal and hand cues are permitted during exercises.
- The Handler must have an 80% pass rate on the theory assessment and 100% on the practical assessment.
- If you do not achieve 100% in your practical assessment, you will be able to re-sit the practical
 test without charge when the next K9 Assessments are held.
- The cost of the assessment is \$20.00.
- Please obtain an application form at the office, and submit it with your \$20 fee at least 2 weeks prior to the test date.
- Once you have paid you will be given your test booklet with all the practical exercises listed and explained, plus your homework questionnaire.
- To allow time for marking, your written homework <u>must</u> be submitted at the Office at least 1 week prior to the practical test.
